Background

Following recent reports from Policy Connect's Skills and Manufacturing Commissions, which called for more local influence funding powers in relation to skills and Local Industrial Strategies, this roundtable will explore new approaches to understanding local labour markets and their policy implications.

Profiles

Nicola Richards MP, West Bromwich East

Nicola was elected to Parliament in December 2019, where she has since joined the Women and Equalities Select Committee, and become a Vice Chair of the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Skills & Employment.

Prior to this Nicola was elected to Dudley Council in 2015. She served as Vice-Chair of the Children's Services Scrutiny Committee and as Chair of the Overview and Scrutiny Management Board. Alongside serving as the Chair of the Black Country Young Conservatives from 2015 Nicola worked as Content Creator for West Midlands Metro Mayor Andy Street.

Prof Alan Penn, Professor in Architectural and Urban Computing, Space Syntax Laboratory & Chief Scientific Adviser, MHCLG

Professor Alan Penn is the Chief Scientific Adviser at the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG). A Professor in Architectural and Urban Computing at University College London (UCL),

Alan's research focuses on understanding the way that the design of the built environment affects the patterns of social and economic behaviour of organisations and communities. Before joining MHCLG, Alan was Dean of The Bartlett Faculty of the Built Environment at UCL. He was Chair of the Architecture, Built Environment and Planning sub-panel for REF2014 and for RAE2008. Alan is a board member of Space Syntax Ltd, a technology spin-out from UCL.

Dr Neave O'Clery, Associate Professor, Centre for Advanced Spatial Analysis

Dr Neave O'Clery is currently Associate Professor at the Centre for Advanced Spatial Analysis (CASA) at University College London where she leads a research group focused on data-driven models for economic development and the emergence of complexity for urban systems.

Neave completed her PhD in Mathematics at Imperial College, following which she was a Fulbright Scholar and Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Centre for International Development, and a Senior Research Fellow at the Mathematical Institute at the University of Oxford.

Francesca Froy, Research Fellow, The Bartlett

Francesca is currently a Research Fellow at The Bartlett and involved in research and teaching at Space Syntax, the School of Planning and the Institute for Innovation and Public Purpose.

Prior to this, Francesca was a senior policy analyst at the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) where she led international reviews on local policy implementation and governance, such as the OECD Skills Strategy. She has extensive experience of analysing and promoting public sector innovation at the city and regional level, with a particular focus on economic development and employment policies.
